#### ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE

Your camper should arrive at Chrysalis at 9 am each day. If your child will be late, please let us know by calling (830) 257-6340. We are sorry, but we can not sign in children prior to 9 am because our staff have other responsibilities.

Camp ends at 3 pm each day. All campers must be picked up between 3 and 3:15. To ensure the safety of your child, our policy requires that all campers be signed out at the close of each camp day by a person designated on the Health Form.

Family and friends are welcome to come at 1:30 pm on Friday for our closing worship and program.

#### DIRECTIONS TO CAMP

##### From I-10:

Exit 508 (Hwy 16)  
Turn go South on Hwy 16 through Kerrville.  
Travel approximately 12 miles from I-10 to FM 1273 (Upper Turtle Creek Rd.)  
Turn right and go 1.5 miles.  
Camp is on the right.

##### From Kerrville:

Go south on Hwy 16 out of Kerrville.  
Travel approximately 8 miles from the edge of town to FM 1273 (Upper Turtle Creek Rd.)  
Turn right and go 1.5 miles.

#### SWIMMING

Campers will have the opportunity to swim each day. Camp lifeguards and lookouts will be on duty. All campers will be tested to determine their swimming ability on the first day. Non-swimmers will be allowed to swim in the shallow area only, even with a flotation device. If you do not wish your child to swim, please let us know on the first day of camp.

Swimming is one of the first things that we do during the Day Camp day. It is great if campers come dressed in their swim attire each day. This insures campers the maximum amount of swim time.

#### HEALTH AND WELLNESS

Please fill out the health history form and activities release form as completely as possible. Be certain to sign it!

If your child takes medication, please note that the prescription medicine should be brought to camp and turned in to the health center in its original container. Campers should not bring non-prescription medication. Non-prescription medications are covered on the health form.

On the first day of camp, all campers will check in with the Day Camp Director. At this time, all medications are checked in and campers may be screened for lice, athlete's foot and any pre-existing conditions that may effect their participation in camp activities.

In the event of serious camper injury or illness, it is Cross Trails Ministry's policy to notify parents immediately by phone. Your insurance company will be responsible for the cost of any injury to or illness of your child while at camp. Cross Trails Ministry carries secondary accident insurance only.

#### THE CAMP STORE "THE COCOON"

The Chrysalis camp store, "The Cocoon", will be open Friday at 1pm before the community celebration and closing worship. Snack items are available for purchase at \$1.

The Cocoon also sells various camp attire and memorabilia (T-shirts, caps, jewelry, stuffed animals, etc). Shirts sell for \$20, hats and caps range from \$5 to \$20, and stuffed animals cost \$8 to \$10. All other items range in price from \$1 to \$35.

Cash, checks, Mastercard, Visa, and Discover are accepted at the Cocoon. Checks may be made payable to Camp Chrysalis.

#### PHOTO INFORMATION

Parents will be able to view online photos of camp at the end of the week. For viewing of or purchasing pictures, we will be giving you a form with information at your first check in explaining how to access your photos. We will also be taking a group photo that will be printed as an 8x10 available by preorder at your first check-in for \$5.00

#### COMMUNITY CELEBRATION!

All immediate family members of campers are invited to attend our Community Celebration!

We will begin our community celebration Friday at 1:30 pm with root beer floats and move into our celebration and closing worship at 2 pm. We are excited to have your campers showcase what they have been learning during the week as well as spend time together with you in worship.
